We watched many performances in the primary school. After that, we went to the beach to plant corals. We watched the sunset too. Lastly, we went to a supermarket.

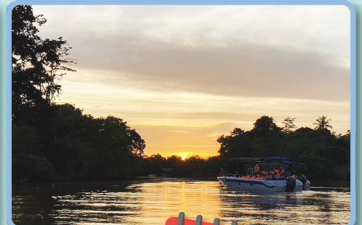
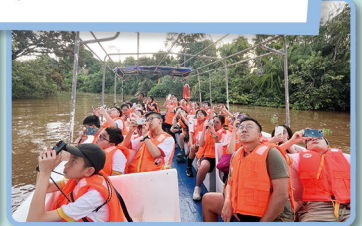
My Discovery:

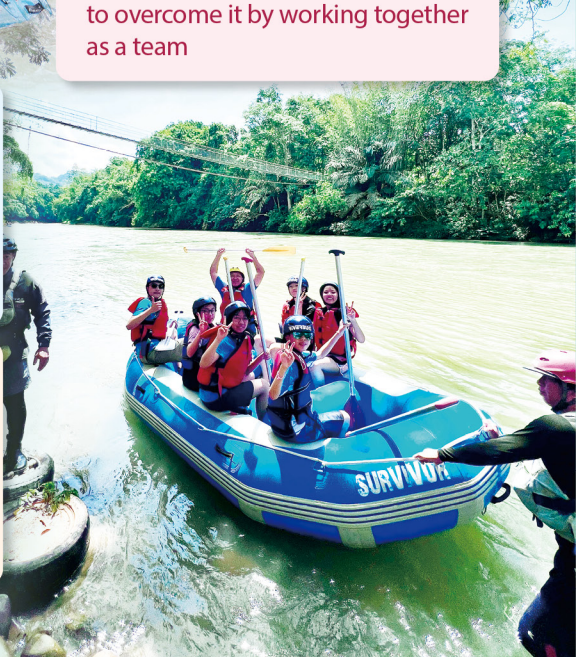
The rafting staff team kept giving instructions, but when my hat got blown away during the ride, it made me realise that we must be careful in everything.
